New Pay Secrecy and Job Ad Laws



The Fairwork Ombudsman has sent me an email advising that the <u>Australian</u> <u>Government's new "Secure Jobs, Better Pay Legislation" passed in December 2022</u>. The new laws outline changes to what can be included in job advertisements and what sorts of information can no longer be hidden or made secret in employment contracts or other workplace instruments.
